



WESTERN AUSTRALIA, 2022

In 2022, there were 96 TB cases notified in Western Australia at the rate of 3.4 cases per 100,000 population. This represented a 32.9% decrease from the numbers notified in 2021, reflecting the impact of COVID-19 pandemic related migration changes and border closure.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA TUBERCULOSIS CONTROL PROGRAM

The WA TB Control Program (WATBCP) located at the Anita Clayton Centre offers a specialised public health service that provides a state-wide outpatient service for the treatment, surveillance and prevention of tuberculosis. The WATBCP provides Specialist Medical advice to all cases of Active TB and Latent TB infection. There is a dedicated paediatric clinic to ensure the needs of children and their families are met. Individual case management for all clients is a nurse led approach that is an integral part of the success of the WATBCP
